## THE ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year consists of the first semester, the second semester and the summer session

The first semester and the second semester take 18 weeks in duration ; the summer session is 6 weeks.

The first semester begins in June, the second semester in November and the summer session in mid-March.

The academic calendar can be obtained at the office of the Academic Services Division of the individual campus.

## UNIVERSITY SYMBOL

The symbol shows a circle with a graph of an exponential function  $y=e^x$  inside. The symbol represents the university motto in Pali, "Sika Wirunhi Sampatta" which means "Education is Growth"

The University colors are grey and red. Grey is considered the color for the brain, red for the blood. Hence grey takes on the meaning of "the thinking process" and red of "bravery", and together the colors mean "to have the courage to think bravely".

## OBJECTIVES

The University is concerned with the development of man as an individual and as a social being. It endeavours to encourage the pursuit of knowledge and also to increase the student's capacity to earn a living and to be self-reliant in the modern world by developing effective communication ability, the art of critical thinking, leadership and social responsibility.

The University is also concerned with developing the student's appreciation of Thai culture and attitudes, and the importance of achieving a balance and rapport between all sections of the community both urban and rural, an ideal fundamental to the Thai way of life.

## PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE

Srinakharinwirot University was established by Royal Decree in 1974. The name Srinakharinwirot which means "The University which is the glory of the city" was given by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulayadej.

Established in 1949 the Institution has a long history in the field of teacher training for the upper levels. In 1954 the School of Higher Teacher Training at Prasarnmit, Bangkok, became the College of Education and was authorized to grant a Diploma in Education and Bachelor, Master and Doctoral degrees in Education. The College opened with 200 students. Today at the eight campuses of Srinakharinwirot there are over 20,000 students.

In 1955 two branches, one at Patumwan and the other at Bangsaen, were added as affiliates of the College of Education. Other branches were added, at Pitsanuloke (1967), Mahasarakham and Songkhla (1968), Bangkok (1969) and Palasuksa (1970).

Each campus offers a Bachelor degree program in Education. In 1955 Prasarnmit campus opened evening classes known as the Twilight Program for teachers in service. This program is now a feature of every campus, and today there are over 10,000 students enrolled in the Twilight Program; that is, about half the Srinakharinwirot student population.

In 1961 Prasarnmit campus admitted its first graduate students in a two-year program leading to a Master of Education degree. Twelve graduate diploma programs were offered in 1963; another in Special

Education was initiated in 1973. Today both Programs have become master degree programs. In 1974 the two doctoral degree programs in Curriculum Research and Development, and Development Education were offered.

In 1976 Prasarnmit added courses work leading to Bachelor's degree in Arts (B.A.) and Science (B.S.) Bangsaen embarked on a Master degree program with an M.Ed.—Biology, and Pitsanuloke did likewise with an M.Ed.—Educational Administration.

Also in 1976 the Bangkok College of Nursing became affiliated to the University. A joint degree of B.Ed.—Nursing Education is now offered.

Looking towards the future, while it is possible to foresee considerable expansion within the present framework, more faculties may be needed to meet the developmental needs of the country.

For example more physicians and nurses are needed to improve medical services, more graduates in business

administration, engineering and architecture to match the country's growing industrialization, and more specialists in nutrition and food sciences for education, industry and the medical services.

In order to strengthen the academic operation and administration, the university is relocating all campuses in Bangkok into one main campus at Prasarnmit.

## ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

Srinakharinwirot University is a state institution under the jurisdiction of the Office of University Affairs. Financial support from the Government is almost 100%. There are three main bodies within the University organizational structure, namely, the University Council, the Administrative Board, and the Faculty Senate, with policy-making, governing, and advisory roles, respectively.

## UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION

Due to the great distances which separate some of the campuses — Songkhla is over 1,000 km. from Bangkok—the organization of the University Administration is based on the organizational model of the main campus

The President has jurisdiction over all campuses and his authority is delegated to the Vice—Presidents at the other campuses.

In order to make the University administration more effective the President appoints four Vice—Presidents at the main campus to assist him in the areas of Campus Administration, Academic Affairs, Planning and Development, and Student Activities.

Each campus has its own vice president acting as the president of the campus carrying out the university

policies. All deans and directors of the main campus, Prasarnmit, co-operate with Associate Deans of the branch campuses in order to promote the academic program of the university. Department Heads may hold his office at any campus to co-operate with the Department Heads of the branch campuses.

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## ADMISSION

Undergraduates are admitted only once a year at the beginning of the academic year. Information and admission form can be obtained at the Academic Services Division of any campus.

## ADMISSION QUALIFICATIONS

### Four Year Programs

Applicants for all four year programs must be Secondary School Graduates or the equivalent, and must satisfy and special faculty requirements.

### Two Year Programs

This program applies only to the Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Degree. Applicants must have a

Higher Certificate in Education, or the equivalent, and must satisfy any special faculty requirements.

## ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

### FOUR YEAR AND TWO YEAR PROGRAMS

Applicants for all four year programs must pass either the National Entrance Examination of the Office of University Affairs or the Entrance Examination of Srinakharinwirot University ; those for two year programs must pass the Entrance Examination of Srinakharinwirot University,

## REGISTRATION

The dates and the procedure for registration are announced by the University each semester or session. The students' programs of study are usually supervised by their advisers.

## ACADMIC REGULATIONS

## Credit System

Each course given is considered to be worth a specified number of credits

1 credit is equivalent to 1 hour of lecture each week

2 hours of laboratory work each week

3 hours of practicum (field trip, workshop) each week

Number of credits assigned to a course also determines the time a student is expected to spend outside class each week

## Academic Status

A student's academic standing is measured by the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of each semester. Students must maintain "C" or 2.00 average or better to remain in Good Standing Status. Those who have CGPA between 1.75 and 1.99 are on Probation Status and must raise their CGPA in order to remain enrolled.

## Attendance

In order to be eligible to take his final examination a student must have attended at least 80% of the total class hours.

### Graduation Requirements

Students must meet all requirements of the program with a CGPA of not less than 2.

Four year program students must complete their studies within six years, two year program students within three years.

### Honors

Second Class Honors are awarded to four year program students who achieve a CGPA of 3.00 or above and have no D's or E's in their academic records.

First Class Honors are awarded to four year program students who achieve a CGPA of 3.50 or above and have no D's or E's in their academic records.

#### Application for Graduation

Students must apply for graduation in the semester in which they expect to complete their degrees. Application should be sent to the Academic Services Division within the last month of their last semester.

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## SCHOLARSHIP

### The ChumIbol Scholarship

Among the scholarships is the Bhumibol Scholarship which was established with money granted by His Majesty, the King of Thailand. Srinakharinwirot University, Prasarnmit distributes annual scholarships from the Bhumibol Fund for deserving students in all campuses. The students are awarded the Bhumibol Scholarship by His Majesty the King during the commencement ceremony.

### The SWU Foundation

The Srinakharinwirot University Foundation was established in 1975 when a sum of 100,000 Baht (US\$ 5,000) had been collected by fund-raising activities. The Foundation consists of a committee with a managing Director and the President of the University as President. Financial aid for the needy student and scholarships for faculty wishing to study abroad are two main areas of Foundation assistance.

## ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The Alumni Association was first formed in 1964 by the three College of Education campuses, Prasarnmit, Patumwan. and Bangsaen. At present former students of any campuses are eligible to join the Srinakharinwirot University Alumni Association.

The objective of the Association is to promote the interests in the University, establish and maintain the contact between the University Alumni and the students.

The administration of the Association are guided by a President and Board of Directors elected from the alumni members for a period of two years.

The Association publishes a bi-monthly newspaper which is circulated free to members, observes social occasions relevant to the University (Foundation Day, for example) and also works closely with the Srinakharinwirot University Foundation in promoting fund-raising activities.



## THE BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE RESEARCH INSTITUTE (BSRI)

The Institute was originally called the International Institute for Child Study, and was established in 1955 as a joint venture of UNESCO and the Government of Thailand. The original purposes of the Institute were (a) to carry out cross-cultural research on child development, (b) to provide training for research workers from Thailand and from other countries in the research methodology and principle of child development and child guidance, and (c) to disseminate research findings for improvement of the care and education of children in school and at home.

In 1963 the Institute was designated a national agency and became the Bangkok Institute for Child

Study, The purposes of the Institute remained essentially the same, except that the training of students from other countries was no longer considered a major responsibility and research projects were directed increasingly toward practical problems in Thailand.

In 1975 after the College of Education had become Srinakharinwirot University the name of the Institute was changed to the Behavioral Science Research Institute. Now as an autonomous research unit of the University, the Institute is funded from the University's budget.

The Institute mainly provides research in collaboration with organizations such as the National Research Council, the National Education Board, and Thailand National Commission for UNESCO.

The Institute also has an instructional role and collaborates with the Graduate School as well as other

departments of the University in teaching both at the undergraduate and post-graduate levels.

The Institute's staff serve all year round with many organizations as resource persons, lecturers, research consultants and active research participants. By means of this collaboration, the Institute maintains close contact with the National Research Council, the National Statistics Office, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Public Health, the Ministry of Interior, the National Economics Development Board, UNESCO, UNICEF, and other international agencies.

The Institute's library contains a varied selection of up-to-date books and research journals on education, psychology and sociology, together with a number of other books and journals on related fields. Other accommodation includes a machine room, two one-way-screen

laboratories, a lecture room, a secretarial office, conference room and other office space for staff. The Institute has access to computer systems in the University, the National Statistics Office and other governmental and private organizations in Bangkok.

## THE EDUCATIONAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL TEST BUREAU

The Department of Educational Research was established at Prasarnmit under the College of Education Act of 1954. In 1961 the Department was extended to include the newly-created Test Bureau which was a unit of the Department of Teacher Training, Ministry of Education. The present title, The Educational and Psychological Test Bureau was adopted in 1974 when the College of Education became Srinakharinwirot University.

The functions of the Bureau are as follows :-

1. To construct and standardize valid and reliable measuring instruments at all levels.
2. To carry out basic research projects in group learning.

3. To stimulate, facilitate, and coordinate the research effort of all members of the University staff, and to help them develop adequate research.

4. To provide technical assistance and guidance to graduate students in designing and carrying out research.

5. To provide in-service training for teachers in expanding their understanding of desirable evaluation practices.

6. To provide co-operation and technical assistance to other educational agencies and organizations in carrying out their own research projects.

7. To provide for the publication and distribution of all research findings.

A main activity of the Bureau has been in developing a wide range of tests at the elementary, secondary and tertiary levels. Forty sub-tests have been developed at the elementary level in the fields of Art, English, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences, Thai, and Scholastic Aptitude. Twenty two sub-tests have been developed at secondary level in the same subjects and twenty seven sub-tests at tertiary level, all in the field of Scholastic Aptitude.


The Bureau provides regular in-service training courses for practising teachers from all over Thailand. There are short courses of two weeks duration and courses extending over a period of four months.

The Bureau developed the Srinakhariwirot University Entrance Test which is known as CESAT (The

College of Education Scholastic Aptitude Test), and has also provided entrance tests for many other institutions

The Bureau has a small library of books and periodicals on statistics and measurement, and a wide selection of tests both in Thai and English.

## SRINAKHARINWIROT, PRASARNMIT

### *Location*

Prasarnmit campus occupies a 16.19 hectare site on Soi Prasarnmit, 400 metres off Sukhumwit Road, a main East-West thoroughfare. Prasarnmit is near the city centre and about 30 minutes by road from Don Muang, the national airport. Although centrally situated Prasarnmit is in the heart of a quiet residential area.

### *History*

The Institution had its origin in Prasarnmit Campus and the brief note already given on the develop-

ment of the University contains the history of the campus.

However it might be appropriate to note here that the technical and financial assistance were received from the International Co-operative Administration, Washington, and the United States Operations Mission to Thailand (USOM), through a contract with Indiana University. This contract terminated in 1962, and during that period over 100 members of staff were provided with assistance to study abroad. This early aid helped provide a foundation for the future development of the Institution.

### *Specialities*

Srinakharinwirot Prasarnmit; the main campus has the special function of being the headquarters for administrative affairs of the university and is also

the academic centre for graduate studies particularly in the field of Education.

### *Facilities*

#### Library

The Library contains about 120,000 books and receives 439 periodicals in English and 292 in Thai. There is a Non-book Collection which contain over 2,000 film strips and about 500 films.

*Ajarn Kachon Library*, on the third floor of the main library building, has a large collection of rare books and references on ancient Thai history. It possesses documents, research papers on the history of Thailand as well as those of other countries in the South East Asia.

### Audio Visual Services

Many technical facilities used in teaching in the Department of Educational Technology are also available for use by other teaching departments, the Graduate School and the Elementary and Secondary Demonstration Schools. There are a TV studio, a 70 seater film projection theatre, a graphics studio, a photographic studio and a maintenance workshop.

### Printing Unit

The "Rotoprinter" is used for a wide variety of off-set printing work, from text-books to the Srinakharinwirot Monthly Newsletters, leaflets, tickets, receipt books, and posters.

### Computing Unit

Prasarnmit hired computing facilities from a number of organizations including the National Statistics Office,

IBM, the Bangkok Data Centre, and Wang Computer Systems.

In 1974 the Institution obtained its own facilities with the purchase of a Wang 2200 computer, mainly used for courses on fundamental programming and analysis of research data of the Behavioral Science Research Institute. The rapid scoring of Srinakharinwirot Entrance Examination has been operated by this computer.

#### Language Laboratories

The language laboratory at Prasarnmit has been a feature in the Department of Western Languages with the aid from the Indiana University contract. About ten years later the installation was completely replaced by a 40 carrell laboratory which is still in use. However to meet the increased demands for language training a new

42 carrell laboratory using cassette recorders was added in 1977.

The main use of the laboratories is in teaching English Language courses, and they also used regularly by the Departments of Music, Thai, and Linguistics. Teaching materials are mostly written by the instructors themselves and produced with the facilities of the laboratories.

### *Student Services*

#### Orientation

Orientation and information services are administered by the Academic Services Division under the Supervision of the Vice-President for Student Activities. There is an orientation program for freshmen at the beginning of the first semester and the final one for the senior students at the end of their academic program.

## Counseling

Counseling services are administered by the Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology. These services are available confidentially, and at any time during the university year.

## Loans

Loan funds available to students are administered by the Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology

The Bangkok Rotary Club donated 100,000 Baht to the Prasarnmit Loan Fund. This was strengthened the following year with a further donation of 50,000 Baht. Also From time to time donationa comes from staff and student fund-raising activities.

## *Scholarships*

Including the Bhumitol Scholarship, there are also scholarships from other institutions, such as former instructors, alumni association members, private organizations and well-wishers.

## Career Planning and Placement

The Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology acts as an employment agency for on-campus and off-campus work, information on jobs, and career Counseling.

## Dormitories

Prasarnmit campus has no dormitories but accommodation is available privately in a number of apartment blocks close to the campus.

### Food Services

There are a number of privately-operated food stalls which offer a wide variety of dishes throughout the day and evening at a cost of about 15 baht for a three course meal.

### Co-Operative Shop

The Co-operative Shop run by the students sells stationery, household necessities, and groceries. It is open between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week-days.

### Post and Telegraph Office

The Post and Telegraph Office is at the Education Building. Mailing, telegraph and money order are in service every day.

### Health and Safety Services

A full time nurse is in attendance day and evening through out the year for any first-aid services.

### Mental Health Services

A Mental Health Center is administered by the Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology. A clinical psychologist and a part-time psychiatrist are available, Psychological tests are administered when required.

### Recreation Facilities

Tennis courts and a gymnasium are available for students as well as the people in the communities around.

### *Cultural Activities*

The Thai Classical Music and Dance Group was organised in 1957 by a small group of professors and students who wished to join other like-minded people to preserve and promote their ancient cultural heritage

before it totally dies out. Every year the group arranges an educational tour to visit neighbouring countries for the exchange program. They went to Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia. Their performances were very successful. Moreover in 1976 the group traveled to Europe to attend the Oriental Music Festival at Durham University, England. In 1979 they conducted a workshop for advanced music studies at Britten-Pears School, Aldelburgh. They visited University of Cambridge for a short lecture demonstration, the BBC for a recording program. Their performance brought extraordinary result.

### *Location*

Patumwan campus occupies a 1.25 hectare site in the heart of the city near Chulalongkorn University and the Royal Bangkok Sports Club, and only a few minutes walk from Siam Square, one of the main shopping and entertainment centers.

### *History*

Patumwan was conceived as a Secondary School Teacher Training Division attached to the Triem Udom Suksa School, an elite senior secondary school under the administration of the Secondary Education Department, Ministry of Education. High school graduates were

admitted for three year training programs in Arts and Science. A Secondary School Teacher Certificate was awarded.

In 1955 Patumwan became part of the College of Education but continued to specialize in the training of secondary school teachers. The three-year certificate program was replaced by a four-year Bachelor Degree program in Education (Secondary School Teaching).

Since 1974 and the advent of university status Patumwan campus, despite a cramped site and limited facilities, has instituted new degree programs in Arts (B A.) and Science (B.S.), and established corresponding twilight programs to meet the growing demand for higher education in the country.

### *Specialities*

Patumwan campus has developed a special emphasis on the training of secondary school teachers, particularly

specialists in Western languages such as English, French and German.

### *Facilities*

#### Library

The library contains 29,787 volumes in Thai 22,674 volumes in English, 107 Thai journals and 96 English journals.

#### Audio Visual Service

The Department of Educational Technology serves other departments in preparing audio-visual aids and other instructional materials.

#### Language Laboratories

The Campus has two language laboratories : one in English, and the other in French.

### Demonstration School

The Campus has its own Demonstration School for students teaching—practice and for the development of pedagogical innovations. The school admits pupils from grades 5—12.

### *Student Services*

#### Orientation

The Campus organizes two series of orientation programs annually. The initial orientation on the first week of the first semester introduces freshmen to the campus way of life, academic programs and university rules and regulations as well as to the faculty members. The final orientation, on the other hand, aims at giving advice and guidance to seniors regarding their prospective employment, in-service performance and opportunities

for further education. This takes place in the last semester of their four-year program.

Periodicals, pamphlets, booklets and other handouts on academic affairs, student placement and further education are issued to students.

#### Counseling Service

The Campus provides two types of counseling service. First, a faculty member is assigned to individual students to give advice on course registration, learning processes, and personal problems. In addition, students may seek advice on personal problems from counseling specialists in the Counseling and Educational Psychology Division.

#### Loans, awards and Scholarships

The Campus administers different types of financial assistance such as loans to needy students and lunch

stipends from donations from within and outside the University. Furthermore, the Campus also administers a number of student awards, grants and scholarships on behalf of banks, business enterprises and individual philanthropists.

#### Career Planning And Placement

The student placement service is administered by the Counseling and Educational Psychology Division, allotting special tuition, jobs and summer vacation employment.

#### Health and Safety Services

The Health Education Division maintains a nursing ward for first-aid emergencies, arranges regular campus visits by doctors, and medical treatment in hospital for students and staff.

## SRIKAKHARINWIROT, BANGSAEN

### *Location*

Srinakharinwirot University, Bangsaen campus is located at Tambol Sansook, Amphur Muang, Cholburi Province, about 100 kilometers east from Bangkok.

### *History*

Srinakharinwirot, Bangsaen was formerly entitled the College of Education in 1955 and was the first place, among the provincial areas, to offer college level of education.

In 1974 the College of Education, Bangsaen was established as Srinakharinwirot University, Bangsaen Campus.

### *Specialities*

The special purposes of the Bangsaen campus is to offer academic subjects as well as higher vocational education, especially to encourage the researches on the latter area of studies, to offer services to the communities and to preserve their cultures.

### *Outstanding Feature*

Bangsaen Marine Science Center : in 1970. The Zoological Museum and Marine Aquarium at Bangsaen Campus was officially opened to public. At present the facilities are too small and deteriorated by age to accommodate the increasing visitors and collections. In order to improve the situation, the University intended to construct a new facility and requested a cooperation of the Japanese Government.

The new facility is to be named *Bangsaen Marine Science Center*. The Center will comprise three principal

components—marine research apuarium, marine animal museum and laboratories. It is scheduled that detailed design will be completed by the end of July 1981, construction work will be commenced in the beginning of October 1981 and will be completed by the end of February 1982.

The planned Bangsaen Marine Science Center is expected to become the best of its kind not only in Thailand, but in Southeast Asia, and help promote research studies, development of marine resources and education. Particularly, it is anticipated that the Center will plan a role of the central research facility on Thai inshore marine animals under the joint research collaboration with other universities and research institutes in Thailand.



The evening or Twilight program began in 1969 with the objective of giving practising teachers the chance to improve their qualifications.

Pitsanuloke introduced a Master Degree program in 1977 and was the first regional university to offer a Master Degree in Educational Administration.

### *Specialities*

The University at Pitsanuloke concentrates on providing well-qualified graduates in Education. Specialities are the Master Degree in Educational Administration and the development of Sukhothai Studies, with an emphasis on document collection, research, and co-operation with other centres in Thailand and in other countries.

*Outstanding Feature*

*Sukhothai Studies Center Project* : In order to conserve and promulgate the glory of Thai culture as can be seen in the art, anthropology, literature, language, tradition, culture, history and economy and social structure, the university has established the Sukhothai Studies Center Project at Srinakharinwirot University, Pitsanuloke Campus. The purpose of the center is to study and carry out research in all areas relevant to Sukhothai and to collect antiques and documents and to promote the spread of Knowledge about Sukhothai.

Since its establishment in 1974 the center with an office located in the Administration building of Srinakharinwirot University, Pisanuloke has provided a document library and collected numerous artifacts. The center has conducted 3 Sukhothai Guide Programs under the auspices

of the Thai Tourist Organization in 1978, 1979, and 1980. Research on historical geography and dialectology has been carried out by the Geography Department and the Departments of Oriental and Western Languages. The center provides services such as lectures, tours and slides. In addition, scholarly research and seminars have been carried out.

### *Facilities*

#### Library

The Library contains over 30,000 books and also serves students from Pibulsongkram Teachers College and the nursing students from Putachinaraj Hospital.

#### Audio Visual Service

The Department of Educational Technology provides instructors as well as audio-visual teaching aids and equipments for the campus and other teaching centers.

*Student Services*

The Campus provides the regular student services, which include orientation, counseling, housing ( 1 male, 4 female dormitories) food Service—both campus and public canteens, fellowships and scholarships, part-time job provision, university store service, mailing service, and many recreational activities.

## SRINAKHARINVIROT, MAHASARAKAM

### *Location*

Srinakharinwirot University, Mahasarakam campus is located in Mahasarakam province in the north eastern part of Thailand.

### *History*

The University was formerly established in 1968 as the College of Cducation, Mahasarakam, with the intention to receive students from that province and from the northern part of the country. The college became a university, as Srinakharinwirot University, Mahasarakam campus in 1974.

### *Specialities*

The Mahasarakam campus encourages both research works and projects. Examples of complete research works are as follows :

1. The condition of the village settlements in the north eastern part of Thailand.
2. The study of the political interest and political background and the reasons of the people who can vote for the M.P.
3. Beliefs and faiths of the people in the north eastern part of Thailand.
4. Investigation of the insects as food in the north eastetn part of Thailand.
5. Encouragement of handicraft in the north eastern part of Thailand.

Srinakharinwirot University, Mahasarakam also planned to produce graduates in arts and sciences

## SRINAKHARINWIROT, SONGKLA

### *Location*

Srinakharinwirot University, Songkhla, is located on Kanchanawanit Road, Khow Roop Chang sub-district, Songkhla, approximately 7 kilometers from the town centre of the provincial capital. Situated on 250 rai (96 acres), the university campus is adjacent to Songkhla Teachers College. The shared land of both institutions comprises an area of 615 rai (236 acres). Songkhla, the most southerly campus of Srinakharinwirot, is about 1000 kilometers from Bangkok. The town of Songkhla (population 50,000) is a popular holiday resort and fishing centre. There are good communications by road, rail, sea and air. The airport is, 30 minutes by road

from the campus, at Hat Yai, a commercial centre sometimes called the 'Gateway to Malaysia'. Over 80% of the local population are muslim.

### *History*

At its inception in October 1968, the College of Education, Songkhla was officially established as a branch of the College of Education, Bangkok. Degrees were granted upon the completion of a two year program to those students who previously obtained a Diploma in Education or a Higher Certificate in Education.

### *Specialities*

The university has placed a special emphasis on training of competent teachers in Chemistry and English.

### *Outstanding Feature*

#### *The Institute for Southern Thai Studies*

It is an outstanding part of the university. Since

the culture of Southern Thailand stands apart in some aspects from those of the other regions of the country, the studies of it have been encouraged. In 1966 a project was initiated to establish a center for promotion of southern Thai Language and Culture, and subsequently in 1980 this center was chartered as the Institute of Southern Thai Studies. The institute comprises the museum of work of arts, the Folk Literature Library, The Vipavadi Rangsit House, The Chinese-style cabin, the Research division and the Open Theatre.

The institute is open daily during 8.00-12.00 a.m, and 1.00-4.30 p.m. Those who wish to donate objects of value to southern Thai studies Institute may contact the institute at Srinakharinwirot University, Southern Region Campus, Songkla.

## *Facilities*

### Library

The library of Srinakharinwirot University, Songkhla is a two-storey building centrally-located and well-equipped for serving the needs of both students and faculty. The library contains approximately 13,260 volumes in English and 24,463 volumes in Thai. In addition there is a broad range of periodicals, newspapers, maps and other items.

### Educational Technology Center

The Center shares the same building as the University Library. It provides audio visual services for students, staff members, and the community. The services include the production of educational materials for university staff members, and schools in the vicinity and

recording significant activities on campus in pictures, slides, and on videotape. The center co-operates with the Faculty of Education in the instruction of Educational Technology courses.

### *Student Services*

#### Orientation

Orientation and Information services are arranged by the Guidance and Educational Psychology Department throughout the year. Special orientation and information services are given to the graduating students every year.

#### Counseling services

Counseling services are available to all students through the Counseling Center which assists students in both educational and vocational planning, and with problems of academic and personal advice whenever desired.

The Counseling Center helps to co-ordinate the various university orientation programs for freshmen as well as for graduates. It also conducts research on student values and attitudes in order to help the university administration understand the students better and to meet their needs more effectively.

#### Loans

Loan funds available to students are administered by the Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology. All applications for loan funds should be addressed to the Head of the Department. At no time may a student owe the funds over 500 Baht. There is no interest on loans. Loan should be paid back either by instalments or in whole, within a semester.

## Scholarships

Several scholarships are provided for students by private agencies and individuals both from within and from outside Songkhla. The amount of money varies. Most of the scholarships are awarded to deserving students of good conduct who maintain satisfactory Grade Point Averages. Some scholarships are granted to outstanding students for services given to the University or to the community.

Applications for scholarships should be made to the Head of the Guidance and Educational Psychology Department.

## Career Planning and Placement

The Department of Guidance and Educational Psychology is an employment agency for both on-campus and off-campus work. Information on available jobs is displayed on the bulletin board in front of the department.

### Off-campus Housing

Advice is not given officially on off-campus housing. However, students may contact the Guidance and Educational Psychology Department or the Office of Student Activities for advice on safe off-campus housing.

### Moral Guidance

Moral and cultural guidance is offered by the Religion and Culture Group, a student activity.

### Dormitory and Food Services

The University provides dormitory accommodation for those students who wish to live on-campus. The four residential halls are conveniently located within a short distance of the academic buildings.

The University cafeteria is a few minutes walking distance from the residential halls. It provides three well-balanced meals at a reasonable cost. Students are

welcome to bring their own food into the cafeteria. Meals and snacks are obtainable throughout the day until early evening.

#### Health and Safety Services

The Guidance and Educational Psychology Department is responsible for the Health Service. Two rooms in the Faculty of Education are used as temporary rest area for sick students.

#### Clubs. Athletics

Both on-campus and off-campus activities are organized to provide opportunities for the students to develop their capability for responsible leadership, their sociability with others, and their capacity to assume and accept social obligations.



### *Specialites*

Bangkhen at present has an emphasis on the training of science teachers.

### *Facilities*

#### Library

All undergraduates have to take a compulsory course called Library and Study Fundamentals during their first term. The course, which introduces them to such details as bibliography preparation and literature studies, encourages them to make the most of the Library. Apart from the lending service, photocopying and laminating facilities are also available.

#### Audio-Visual Service

The Audio-Visual Center provides service and advice to the teaching staff and the students on audio-

visual aids. The Center is also involved in teaching for the Faculty of Education courses, such as Techniques for Utilizing Audio-Visual Aids and Minor Repair and Maintenance of Technological Hardware.

### The Language Laboratory

The Faculty of Humanities offers language laboratory facilities to both the teaching staff and students. Besides regular courses, those wishing to improve their listening and speaking skills in English have access to tapes and tapescripts prepared by native speakers of English.

### *Student Services*

#### Orientation

An orientation program is provided at the beginning of the semester to introduce the students to university

life, courses requirements, facilities and student activities.

Towards the end of their fourth and final year, students attend a final program in which they are introduced to opportunities for furthering their studies or seeking employment. Government officials for various departments are invited to talk about administration and structure of governmental departments.

#### Counseling Service

Each undergraduate is assigned to a member of the teaching staff, who acts as his academic adviser throughout his studies.

#### Financial Assistance

Bhumibol Scholarship : it is granted by His Majesty the King to Srinakharinwirot University students annually.

Educational Grants : It is given by governmental departments, banks, foundations, or private authorities periodically.

Loans : each undergraduate may apply for a loan of up to 500 Baht for educational purposes

#### Food Service

The canteen provides meals at low cost for staff and students. Occasionally, by way of putting principles into practice, the students taking Nutrition Courses prepare meals for sale cheaply.

#### Co-operative Store

The co-operative store has staff and students as shareholders. The store keeps stationery, household necessities and refreshments.

### Health Service

The facilities of the Health Service are available free of charge to all undergraduates. The students have access to sick rooms, and a medical adviser attends daily during semester time and part of the vacation, for first aid and the treatment of minor complaints.

### *Location*

The campus is situated within National Sports Center compound.

### *History*

The Palasuksa campus of Srinakharinwirot University has long been developed and undergone through several historical changes. Since it was originally one division of the Department of Physical Education, Ministry of Education, it had been known throughout the kingdom

as College of Physical Education, a junior college granting a higher certificate in this academic field. Its name was changed to "The College of Education" at Palasuksa in 1972 upon seeking authorization to grant a bacalaureate degree in physical education through annexing with the College of Education at Prasarnmit. Since the College of Education, with her eight campuses situated in almost all regions of the country, was authorized by the Cabinet to become a university in 1974 and its name was given "Srinakharinwirot University" by His Majesty the King at that time, the name of the College of Education at Palasuksa was and has been right along changed to "Srinakharinwirot University Palasuksa."

Unlike the names of other campuses of Srinakharinwirot University, whose names have been chosen in accordance with the localities within which each of them

is situated, the name chosen by the majority of the staff at the time the university was established and has been "Palasuksa" meaning "Physical Education."

### *Specialties*

It had long been understood by all physical education teachers, graduated from the former College of Physical Education, that special emphasis advocated was excellence on sports performance. However, for the past five years this philosophy has been markedly developed to striving for excellence in academic and sports performance.

Since producing physical education teachers had been a primary goal of this campus, prior to its annexation to the College of Education. Most buildings and grounds were constructed for the purpose of instructing physical education activities. On this campus one will

find the following buildings and sports areas : 3 gymnasias, 2 soccer fields, 3 basketball courts, 1 boxing arena, two classroom buildings, 1 administration building and 1 library and conference-hall building.

### *Facilities*

Besides sports gymnasias and grounds the following are the facilities provided : library, testing and evaluation center, physical fitness center, audio-visual center, Thai music club, international music club, language laboratory, chemistry laboratory, anatomy laboratory, biological laboratory, student cafeteria, staff cafeteria, and a college store.

### *Student Services*

Orientation and Information Service :

This service is usually given in the first and last week of each academic year. In addition, pre-practice teaching orientation services are given twice

in the first semester of every academic year. The offices assigned to be in charge of these services are the student guidance section and the department of curriculum and instruction.

#### Counseling Service

This service has been dynamically active and superbly administered by the student guidance section.

#### Awards and Scholarship Service

Advice on employment and Advice on-off campus housing : these three interrelated services are also the main functions of the student guidance section.

#### Reserved Officers Training Corp Service.

This service to all students, including those of Palasuksa, is legally encouraged by the Ministry of Defense. More than 300 male students enjoy the service supervised by Palasuksa's R.O.T.C. Section every year.

### Extracurricular Activities Services

All students of the campus are encouraged to take part in several activities every semester.

The following are the extracurricular activity clubs actively supervised by appointed staff :
